"Ready to Fly" represents a parallel between young birds and young developing musicians. Just as fledglings learn to use their voices to make the beautiful bird sounds we all know and love, young musicians develop a familiarity with the language of music and learn to communicate and inspire through sound.

The melodies in this piece were inspired by real bird calls: the charming and easily-recognizable two-note call of the black-capped chickadee, and the musical fanfare-like three-note call of the red-winged blackbird. I was also inspired by songbirds in the construction of the piece, using layering and cal-and-response sections to imitate antiphonal bird calls.

In working on this project, I felt strongly about creating a piece that contributes to both the musical and social-emotional growth of students at this level. My hope is that this piece will empower students of all levels to feel "ready to fly" in their musical and personal pursuits.

This piece was commissioned by Tammy Wahlin for the Robbinsdale Area Schools, with support from the Seven Dreams Education Foundation. This project was made possible thanks to the generous support of Marlene Johnson, who has asked to dedicate this piece in memory of her brother, Arnold Johnson, who was a lover of birds. Marlene and Arnold are both graduates of Robbinsdale high schools.

INTO THE FUTURE

When we first discussed this event, Laura Shepard asked if I would mind writing a piece for the event. I was grateful for the invitation and happy for the opportunity.

When I first started teaching in MNPS in 2001, J. Jeff Beckman, the Director of Bands at McGavock was always more than willing to help me in building my program. A program that I very much wanted to grow into one like that of McGavock High School's. Since then, I have always had a great admiration of the legacy that Mr. Beckman, his predecessors and members had created. So, in this piece, I wanted to try and create something for our kids, but at the same time, pay homage to the McGavock High School Band program.

Throughout the piece, I tried to think of the idea that something big is on the horizon. The piece begins with a fanfare figure that heralds the event, building to the first strain. With my great admiration of the McGavock band program's rich history, I felt that the first strain should be regal and stately, reflecting on the achievements and legacy of the McGavock Band. The second strain, is one of anticipation. The anticipation you feel when you know that something big is coming. We arrive at the final statement, echoing the beginning of the piece, a "Coming home". As students move to high school, there is always a great anticipation. There is often worry that it won't be the same, but in the end, high school band is just the next step. There are things that will be different, but at the same time, students realize that it is very much the same, and eventually they realize that when they are in band, they are "home".

Into the Future is a fanfare written for the Future McGavock Band members, who attend Donelson DuPont Hadley, DuPont Tyler and Two Rivers Middle Schools, which are schools in the McGavock Cluster.
